Classroom Happenings

Upper Elementary: The Upper Elementary has adapted well to our temporary classroom and we are enjoying our separation and also our combined times with lower elementary. The students are very independent, helpful, and mature as a whole and seem to truly value their own educations. We are currently studying creation of the cosmos and earth, human needs and beginnings, the Skeletal system, and everyone is doing good work in their own language and math areas. We are writing stories, practicing paragraphs, and using graphic organizers. The students are enjoying Spanish with Ms. Beverley and love having their own Spanish-speaking classmate to help with their pronunciation!

Lower Elementary: The lower elementary class has been immersed in the cosmic curriculum, learning and imagining what the beginnings of the universe, our planet, life, humans, communication and numbers were like. As we spark our curiosity with these big questions we delve into the details as we begin our in-depth study in each subject area. Our class has been getting into the rhythm and routine of the lower elementary work cycle. The younger students have been working on learning how to plan their day and work at the elementary level while older students have been working on managing longer term due dates. We are all happy to be back physically together!

3-6 students: We are learning to respect nature, to observe it and not get in its way. We are collecting many pieces of nature for our nature tray. The students are very much enjoying practical life works, including water
