Preparedness and Getting Dressed

Keep in mind that the temperature and precipitation can change drastically from 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM and we at DMS go outside at least a couple of times per day. To that end, please guide your child in dressing in layers and being prepared for the worst weather of the day. Layers are so useful so they can both be ready for cold and hot temperatures, AND have an extra outer layer when playing on the natural playground without always having to wear their winter coats. Hoodies, t-shirts under long sleeved shirts, and rain coats on rainy days are so useful.

If your child brings home their snow pants etc. over spring break, please wash them and send them back when we return to school. If your child has a change of clothes at school, check in about sizes and weather appropriateness of the clothes. And when we come back from Spring Break, you can choose to send in rain boots to exchange for snow boots.

Classroom Updates

The 3-6 class has so many readers, and so many folks enthusiastic about it. We are reading the Mercy Watson books during read aloud, and everyone is enjoying them so much. If you hear your child ask for toast with a great deal of butter, you can blame Mercy Watson. Today we learned braiding, and it was very well received. Our older students have been excited to learn about the decimal system using the Golden Bead Bank. They love getting all of the beautiful golden beads out on their rugs.

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Lower Elementary has been learning about positive and negative mind, and ways to calm their bodies such as deep breathing and muscle relaxation. They have started science journals to record observations for botany. They are enjoying expanding and refining their skills at gymnastics.

Upper Elementary has been researching weather and the climatic zones of the world. We are enjoying our interest fair topics and gearing up for essay writing. Some students have really been focused this year on cultivating beautiful cursive handwriting and mastering spelling and their efforts are paying off. As spring arrives, we are doing observations of the plants around us, noting venation patterns and other characteristics of the leaves specifically. We love having plants in our classroom to observe throughout the year.
